You will be expected to identify opportunities to deliver digital sessions that will help people get online for the first time or help them do something more with technology.



KS4

The aim of the Digital Communities Wales **KS4 Community Challenge** is to encourage young people who are digital natives and comfortable with the use of technology, to pass on their skills to support and encourage others to use technology in a safe and secure way.

As an individual or a member of a team (3-6 members), you will be expected to identify opportunities to deliver digital sessions that will develop the understanding of e-safety with your target audience.


Digital Communities Wales will deliver a two hour session to support Digital Heroes.
